### **Canada Post Corporation Strategic Review Submission**

The Canada Post Corporation and its services should not be privatized. Canada, and certainly northern Canada, requires a public, accessible postal service.

Canada's Postal Service should remain publicly regulated. Equitable service at the same cost should be universal across Canada.

Canada Post should be given the funding and compensation required to meet delivery standards. If required, the Government of Canada should support financially the Corporation's public policy obligations, including services to rural and remote areas of the country. The exclusive right to deliver letters should be maintained. Requirements to financially contribute dividends to the Government of the Canada should be eliminated or reduced to ensure service standards are maintained and so the Corporation can provide competitive services.

Canada Post, as an institution and its services, contribute significantly to social capital in Canadian communities. This is among the subjects that could be more appropriately addressed through public hearings as part of this review.
